It's September, a great time to expand our knowledge and brush up on our computer skills. Phillip Konecki, at Jewish Family Service, offers the following MS Office "brush up classes." These online classes are free and open to anyone interested. See below for details. Phil will be joining us at our House Meeting on 9/19 at 1pm to tell us more about how we can take advantage of these great learning opportunities.



MS Word

MS Word 2016 is a 5-day long class designed for beginners as well as those experienced users who are looking for a refresh of basic skills and concepts. Introduces program terminology, file types, entering/editing text, formatting (including non-printed characters, bullets/numbers, alignment, indents, tab stops), columns, tables, raster/vector graphics; among other topics.

MS Excel Basic

MS Excel 2016 is a 5-day long class designed for beginners as well as those experienced users who are looking for a refresh of basic skills and concepts. Introduces program terminology, autofill/flashfill, conditional formatting, ranges/tables, introductory formulas, filtering and data validation; among other topics.

MS Excel Advanced

Designed for users who have a foundational knowledge of MS Excel's basic concepts, this 5-day long class introduces multilevel sorting, advanced mathematic functions, linking with three-dimensional references, alternative data sets, charting and pivot tables; among other topics.

MS PowerPoint

This 3-day long class will cover the basics of MS PowerPoint. Topics will include views, adding/removing slides, sections, entering text, tables, embedding and linking, animation and transitions, synchronous/asynchronous presentations, printing handouts and audience engagement.

Her favorite person in the world personally is her Aunt Janet, who is a real business women that has accomplished much in her life.

Before coming to the Clubhouse, she was bored and lonely after retirement. She realized she needed to be around people. It is this aspect of the Clubhouse that she loves--it has lifted her spirits! She recognizes that we need to be around each other because it improves everything!

Lennie's goals at the Clubhouse include growing her relationships here, learning the layout and continuing to learn more of the opportunities available during the work-ordered day. When the Clubhouse also provides an in-house educational program, it significantly utilizes the teaching and tutoring skills of the members.

They provide a friendly face and psychosocial support to patients.

Accessing the Future at Dallas Colleges



An Interview with Beverly Neu Menassa

We were honored to speak with Beverly Neu Menassa the Associate Dean of Accessibility Services. She manages the Accessibility Services for the 7 campuses of the Dallas Colleges. Beverly has worked with the Colleges for 15 years, and speaking with her, she has such a passion for her work, this is a person

that truly loves her career and does her very best to assist those with disabilities. Using Teams of Coordinators, case managers, and success coaches, they can assist those with mental health problems, whether it be, Bipolar disorder, ADHD, Anxiety, Depression, or other, be successful in the classroom.

The Accessibility Services Department invites the student into their office, reviews their information, and insures all the students' needs are met in regards to their particular disability.

With depression or anxiety, for example; a person may need to be tardy or late, which could come from a medication they are prescribed. The Accessibility Department/Team, can assist with keeping the student from having this late/ Tardy from happening.

They can also provide Quiet Rooms for those who are distracted by too much noise or help with giving students extended time to complete assignments and tests when

ieeded.

Additionally, Note-Taking Services can be provided for those with panic disorders and other disabilities, or if the student needs to exit the classroom quickly. 'Glean' and 'Otter. A', which are new Apps, record the classroom lectures directly to the students smartphone or laptop. They can provide Smart pens with specialized notebooks which connect directly to the students' laptop or smartphone.

Blind students now have text to speech and Braille to speech. All Text books are now available in electronic format for students listening and viewing. FM systems can connect to

hearing aids.

To help students engage in all these wonderful new strategies and technologies, Beverly and her accessibility teams provide virtual workshops in success strategies: like test taking strategies, goal setting, stress management, and how to be successful in the classroom.

We asked if there were any financial support through Accessibility Services for individuals with a Disability Status.

We were told not at this time.

FASFA, a federal program can assist you with information regarding grants and scholarships or you may qualify for TASFA, a state program for continuing education, and work force which may also assist with further information.

We extend Great Thanks to Beverly Neu Menassa for taking time out of her busy schedule to interview and enlighten us with an overview of Accessibility Services for Dallas Colleges. We commend you for the magnificent work your department has achieved.


